- 3. To examine the advantages and disadvantages of Traditional Assessment and Alternative or Performance Assessment.
- 4. To understand what the Common Core State Standards are, how they were developed and ways to use them.
- 5. To learn how to develop assessment criteria based on stated standards and objectives.
- 6. To show three types of Criteria Cards and how to use each.
- 7. To provide an overview of many different types of rubrics.
- 8. To learn the parts of a Complex Rubric and understand when and how to use them.
- 9. To show how to design and assess differentiated learning activities based on standards.
- 10. To understand how and when to use Mini-rubrics..

#### BONUS – Webcast follow up sessions!

In addition to the two-day face-to-face session, Carolyn will also be presenting three 20-minute video segments that can serve as a follow-up for session attendees and a discussion starter for those colleagues who were unable to attend the workshop. These three segments will encourage implementation of workshop ideas and provide an overview of:

- 1. Types of assessment including pre-assessment, formative assessment, summative assessment, standardized assessment and differentiated assessments.
- 2. The Common Core State Standards and how they are used in the assessment process

3. How to develop assessment criteria including criteria cards, complex rubrics and mini-rubrics (A webcast link will be emailed to attendees 2 weeks after the workshop. Attendees will be encouraged to take a "Train the Trainer" role and lead the follow up discussions with their colleagues.)
