About the Workshop:

With the desire to improve assessment comes the need for improved assessment tools. Learn a number of teacher-designed authentic performance tasks and accompanying scoring mechanisms that help teachers in grades 4-12 measure student understanding of content topics in any class, for all subjects, and across the grade levels. Because they are classroom-based, and tied directly to the curriculum, they provide an alternative to the more distant standardized tests.

These performance tasks are designed to evaluate what students know about the topic of study in any class -- Language Arts, Math, Science, Art, Social Studies -- and to what degree they have mastered key course skills -- before, during, and after; they vary in length of time from mini- to midi-to maxi-task; and they focus on different modes – visual, written, oral, and project/performance -- such as:

- writing a student-to-author critical review memo or postcard on an assigned reading
- drawing pictorial SnapShots and posting them into a "Photo Album" with descriptive captions
- writing a persuasive letter about newly learned content information
- presenting round robin mini-speeches to small groups of classmates
- using contemporary music as a vehicle for revealing understandings

Sample performance tasks will be accompanied by an original scoring device called a *ChecBric* – a hybrid made up from a checklist for students and a rubric for teachers. The problem with regular rubrics is that too many students glaze over at the sight of them. The *ChecBric* is more accessible to students – and therefore, more likely to be used. Sample *ChecBrics* include: social studies reading comprehension, language arts/literature analysis, and science informational writing.

This workshop will bridge the gap between theory and practice for practitioners by relating the current thinking on assessment to what is practical, reasonable, and doable.

All sample performance tasks and the procedure to create them come from Mr. Lewin's book, <u>Great Performances: Creating Classroom Performance Assessments</u> (2011, ASCD).
