ABOUT THE WORKSHOP:

How and why do we assess students? What do we learn from assessment? These are the essential questions of this workshop. We will examine assessment terminology and the role of standardized tests, but the major emphasis is on how to use pre-assessment, formative assessment (progress monitoring), and summative assessment tools when differentiating classroom instruction.

We will address how to ensure that standards are linked with curriculum units and how and when to create rubrics. We will also discuss grading and its role and implications in the assessment and learning process. Participants will leave the workshop with rubrics and practical tools they can use in their classrooms immediately!
